In 1989, an earthquake hit Armenia. Over 30,000 people were killed in a matter of minutes. After the quake, a father left the safety of his house and rushed to the school where he knew his son was at the time of the earthquake. When he arrived, he found that the building had been leveled.

He had once made a promise to his son. "No matter what, I'll always be there for you!" As he looked at the pile of debris, he felt hopeless and tears filled his eyes. What could he possibly do? But he kept remembering the commitment he had made to his son.

He remembered where his son's classroom was, in the back right corner of the building, and he rushed to the spot and started digging through the rubble. As he was digging, other heartbroken parents arrived. They were crying and saying "My son!" "My daughter!" Others tried to pull him away from the debris saying, "It's too late! They're dead! You can't help. Go home! Face reality, there's nothing you can do! You're just going to make things worse?"

But to each person he responded, "Won't you help me?" and continued to dig for his son, stone by stone.

The fire chief tried to pull him away, telling him fires were breaking out and explosions were

happening all around them. But the loving, caring Armenian father responded, "Won't you help me?"

The police told him he was endangering others and should go home, but again he replied, "Won't you help me?" No one helped.

Courageously, he proceeded alone. He dug for eight hours ... 12 hours ... 24 hours ... 36 hours ... then, in the 40th hour, he pulled back a boulder and heard his son's voice. He screamed his son's name, "ARMAND!"

He heard back, "Dad! It's me Dad! I told the other kids not to worry. I told them that if you were alive, you'd save me and when you saved me, they'd be saved. You promised, 'No matter what, I'll always be there for you!' You did it, Dad!"

There were 13 other children still alive with Armand. When the building collapsed, it had made a wedge like a triangle, and saved their lives.

Armand's father said to his son, "Come on out, boy!"

"No, Dad! Let the other kids out first, 'cause I know you'll get me! No matter what, I know you'll be there for me!"

For many years, our focus has been on how to evangelize the Etsako area. Besides the usual challenge of lack of funds and other resources, the impact of Islam in this environment has been another reason the work has been slow. But we are determined to continue to push. God has continued to show us open doors for evangelism and church planting.

One such door opened when a Christian woman who is married to a non-Christian man from Iraokhor village came home with her husband after retiring from military service. For awhile this sister was going to worship services at Ogbona village, which is the nearest congregation to her. But because of the difficulties of transportation, this was not easy at all. She wanted to participate in all the church activities, but there was no way she could make the trip several times in one week.

So, against the odds (she is not a native of that village, her husband is not a Christian, and she is a woman) she determined to start a congregation. She asked Brother Steven Afosoh for advice on what to do, and Steven then contacted me. We planned a campaign for that village for that Saturday. Brethren came with me from many parts of Akoko-Edo and others joined us from the other counties of Etsako. We went from house to house preaching and teaching the gospel of Christ to the villagers. We did not experience any rudeness that sometimes happens when we preach in Muslim communities.

We gave out tracts, enrolled those who were literate and want to study by mail, and answered many questions from others. Two people obeyed the gospel by the end of the day. We had already made arrangements to rent a little room for worship. On Sunday, we started the first worship of the Iraokhor church of Christ.

We were fortunate to have received some boxes of materials from Mission Printing just the week before, so now we had tracts and Bibles to use. We started the worship with the songbooks I received from Mission Printing as well. We have made arrangements with the Ogbona brethren to continue to send members to help the new congregation. I am also talking with others who could help them. The plan is that every other week two brothers will go worship with them and help them to grow. Village congregations always pose more challenges to grow because of high rates of illiteracy.

Because of the nature of the environment, it was agreed that we needed to come back to that village to preach some more. Our campaigns are more easily organized in the dry seasons, when the roads are a little more passable.

We see great prospects for the growth of Christianity in that village. Two days after the congregation began, another person was baptized and added by the Lord to their family.
