Postal Changes Bring Dramatic Cost Increases To Mission Printing

As you might be aware on May 14, the U.S. postal service will be raising its rates on domestic mail. You might not be aware that it is also making **major and far reaching changes that will impact mail service across the globe** and therefore to our ministry.

Mission printing currently, and for the past many years, has been shipping its material to areas throughout the world by surface mail. No matter the destination, the USPS had one shipping rate (\$1 per lb.) for international surface mail. That is drastically changing. All international mail will not be by air transportation. Also, there will no longer be a flat rate based on weight. Countries will have rate categories assigned to them. These new rates will be anywhere from \$1.60 to \$3.75 per lb. This will cause Mission Printing to experience an annual postage increase of approximately 168%!

In order to get a better representation of what these changes mean to our work, consider the following comparison. The figures in the box below would arise if we took the low end of the new rates (\$1.60) and the average of the new rates (\$2.68) and apply them to our shipments in 2005 and 2006.

2005 shipments: 74, 802 lbs.

present rate cost @ \$1.00: \$74,892
new rate cost @ \$1.60: \$119,827.20
new rate cost @ \$2.68: \$200,710.56

2006 shipments: 67,972 lbs.

present rate cost @ \$1.00: \$67,972
new rate cost @ \$1.60: \$108,755.20
new rate cost @ \$2.68: \$182,164.96.

**THAT IS AN AVERAGE ANNUAL
INCREASE OF \$120,000!**

As you can see, our shipping expense is going to increase dramatically. We are currently consulting with W.B.S. and other church sponsored ministries throughout the brotherhood in order to find possible solutions to lower our expense. The work of bringing the gospel to lost souls across the globe just got a little tougher.

We need everyone's support and prayers that Mission Printing will continue to be a powerful force and tool for the kingdom of God and that Satan will not be able to use this obstacle to his advantage!

It is the intent of Mission Printing that the gospel in its purity, power, and perfection will continue to be spread into all the world, from from any false theories or doctrines. The future holds many uncertainties, but we plan to pursue this work as long as our support continues and the Lord provides a way. After all, the Lord left His church in the world that we may see that it goes to "the uttermost part of the earth."

We will not waver in our dedication to Christ and the lost souls for which He died!

Jesus exclaims in John 4:35, "*Behold, I say to you, lift up your eyes and look at the fields, for they are already white for harvest!*" Christ also states, "*The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest*" (Matthew 9:37-38).

Mission Printing's family is comprised of these laborers and we need your help in the harvest fields today and the days to come!
