A few weeks ago, Mission Printing had fifteen visitors from the Meadow View church of Christ in Mesquite, Texas to take a tour of our facility and observe our volunteer work. They returned recently to volunteer their time and talents to help "World Evangelism by the Printed Page." Bob Watlington said that they plan to come on the second Thursday of next month and are part of 174 seniors, known as the "Prime Timers" in their congregation. Mission Printing is excited about the prospect of having many of the Prime Timers involved with our work.

I was privileged last Tuesday to present an update on Mission Printing to the brothers at the Tarrant County Preacher's Luncheon. Robert Dodson is the coordinator of this monthly event and an article by him will be included in our Mission Printing Newsletter next month. Robert is doing an outstanding job on the TV program, "The Truth in Love" that is on nine different stations each Sunday morning.



This pallet of tracts (about 20,000) was requested by Michael Knappier and sent by truck at his expense to Little Rock, AR. Michael will ship the tracts in his ocean container destined to Accra, Ghana, to be transferred to a truck dedicated for the purpose of evangelism and distributing tracts throughout West Africa.



These two pallets contain 96 boxes (almost 50,000 tracts) for Liberia and were shipped last week for \$2,500. Mission Printing received a check for \$2,500 dedicated to special projects such as this, from a generous donor who loves to see the spread of the gospel. I visited Liberia in January and realized how they were hungering for the written word. Our plan is to ship a full container of tracts next year to the Liberia Bible College in Monrovia.
